Great Northwest Athletic Conference History

The Great Northwest Athletic Conference may be new in name but it soon promises to hold a prominent position within the NCAA Division II arena. Formed in September of 2000 and entering its third season of championship play in 2003-04, the GNAC is comprised of 10 members in five western states.

Three of the members—Alaska Anchorage, Alaska Fairbanks and Seattle Pacific—were charter members of the old Great Northwest Conference for men's basketball in 1982. The GNC merged with the women's Continental Divide Conference to form the Pacific West Conference in 1992. All 10 GNAC members competed in the PacWest through the 2000-01 season.

Alaska Anchorage, Alaska Fairbanks, Humboldt State and Seattle Pacific are longtime Division II members. Humboldt State, formerly of the Northern California Athletic Conference, joined the PacWest in 1998 along with former NAIA programs Central Washington, Saint Martin's, Western Oregon and Western Washington. Northwest Nazarene and Seattle U. came aboard in 1999.

The multi-sport conference sponsors championship play in 12 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's track & field and women's volleyball. Men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball feature full 10-team fields.

Competing for the men's soccer championship in 2003 will be Humboldt State, Seattle Pacific, Seattle University and Western Washington. SPU won each of the three PacWest titles from 1998-2000, sharing the title with Seattle University and Hawaii Pacific in the final year.

NCAA Division II Championships

The NCAA Division II Championships tournament was first contested in 1972 and was termed at that time the College Division. The field of participants has fluctuated over the years, and now stands at 24 teams after expanding the bracket by eight teams from a year ago. Initially, 24 teams received invitations before dropping to 20 in 1973, 16 in 1974 and 10 in 1979. From 1982-96, it was a 12-team bracket before expanding to 16 in 1997.

Division II is divided into eight regions, with three tournament berths in each. The lowest two seeds meet in the first round, with the regional winner determined in the next stage. Quarterfinal pairings will be as follows: Far West-Midwest, South-Southeast, New England-Northeast and Central-Great Lakes. Winners advance to the semifinals.

The semifinal and final rounds have been held at a common site (one of the semifinalists designated as host) since 1987. The site was pre-designated from 1973-79 and Miami has hosted the championship game seven times, Seattle and Tampa four times each.

Seattle Pacific has qualified for NCAA postseason play 28 times and won five national titles. The Falcons were the first Div. II team to win back-to-back titles, that in 1985 and '86. Southern Connecticut matched that feat in 1998 and '99 and is the overall leader with six titles.

Prior to 1972, Division II and III teams competed alongside Division I in a collegiate championship. Seattle Pacific participated in the 1971 tournament, losing in the first round of the regional.
