# CHAMPIONSHIP RECAPS

## From Last to First on Final Event

COLORADO SPRINGS (Apr. 4, 1986) — It really was a last-ditch, desperate attempt simply to save face. But given the brilliance of young and talented team, the final round of the 1986 NCAA Division II Championships was a showcase of just how exhilarating a gymnastics meet can become. Literally speaking, Seattle Pacific University vaulted over the entire eight-team field to claim its first national championship.

The Falcons, whose previous best national finish was fourth place the preceding two years, came to the U.S. Air Force Academy as the second seed behind Southeast Missouri. They had rewritten their record both almost entirely, and were particularly buoyed by the grace and bounce of freshman Barbara Elliott. During the regular season Elliott not only broke a 10-year-old school all-around record, she did it eight times.

SPU defeated 30 of 38 opponents during the regular season (the only losses coming to Division I programs), and then won the West Regional for the third straight year. Yet the promise of a truly special season seemed to be slipping away; the Falcons were in eighth place, 2,500 points behind the leader going into the fourth and final event, the vault.

“When we heard that we were last, we decided to go out with a bang on the last event, to save what dignity we had left,” said Elliott. “We were not going to finish last.”

Led by junior Bonnie Parman, Seattle Pacific hit vault after vault, broke the school team record with a combined vault score of 46.55 and pulled out one of the most improbable comebacks in national meet history. The Falcons finished with a total of 175.80 points to edge defending champion Jacksonville State’s 175.15.

“The vault had been a good event for us all year,” said Coach Laurel Tindall, “but I’ve never seen a team make up that many points in one event at a national meet. It was a tremendous comeback for our girls.”

Elliott stole the show during individual finals, taking top honors in the vault (just ahead of Parman), balance beam and floor exercise. She was the only gymnast to qualify for each event, taking third on the uneven bars. Earlier, she had been third in the all-around.

## No Hurdle Too High

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (Apr. 4, 1992) — No obstacle proved to big for the Falcons to overcome in 1992. Not injuries. Not lack of depth. Not even a late-season slump. Nothing could stand in the way of Seattle Pacific winning its second national crown at the U.S. Gymnastics Federation Championships.

The season opened with eight consecutive wins but then came a string of defeats and the loss of Corine Frohm, the team’s top all-arounder, to a season-ending back injury. At that point, it was questionable whether SPU would even qualify for nationals, let alone keep up its run of 10 consecutive top-four finishes.

Every great team, it seems, overcomes adversity at some point. And the Falcons, as it turned out, became a great team during the final weeks of the season. They won four of their final five decisions, smashing the previous school scoring record by nearly 2.00 points with a 190.50 in the final regular season meet to not only clinch a national berth, but earn the No. 1 seed. In the preliminary round at nationals, they struggled and barely made the cut to finals. But once there, they shined brighter than ever.

Kathie Craddock, a junior, the gold medal winner in the all-around, provided a spark. Chrissy Rice and freshman Anna Sandberg fanned the flame, and SPU slid past No. 2 seed Texas Woman's, 185.85-185.20 for the school's second title in six years.

"For me, winning was much more satisfying this time around," said Coach Laurel Tindall. "We not only won, but we did well, everyone did. Everyone played a part."

## Perfect Ending to a Near-Perfect Season

SEATTLE (Apr. 11, 1997) — Seemingly every time they reached one goal, they reached higher still. And rung by rung they climbed to the end, until there was nowhere left to climb. By then, Seattle Pacific found itself somewhere up above the clouds, a dreamlike 1997 season climaxed by winning the USA Gymnastics Collegiate National Championship. Better still, the Falcons won it and raised the trophy before a gym-full of their faithful fans in Brougham Pavilion.

It was a season not without some drama. In midseason, SPU defeated a top-10 Division I team for the first time, edging crosstown neighbor Washington at home. Then there was the first-ever conference victory, at the Western Independent Championships.

Nothing was as nerve-racking as the final rotation of the national meet. A below average vault was balanced by solid beam score. In between came some clutch routines on the bars, the team's strongest event all season.

Still, the Falcons were behind four-time defending champion Texas Woman's by 0.125 points, as they approached the floor exercise mat for the final time. It turned out to be one victory dance after another. Each of the five counting scores were 9.675 or better, topped by Kathy Siwek's show-stopping, crown-clinching career-high 9.800. It was the team's best floor show (48.700) of the season, and it enabled SPU to pass Texas Woman's by 0.725, but also break the national meet scoring record with a 192.250 total. Stephanie Andrews, competing all-around, accounted for a team-high 37.675.

For good measure, two seniors returned the following evening to conclude their respective careers in fantasy fashion. Amanda King captured the beam title and Mindy Lee Ferguson hit every release cleanly to claim the bars. Deni Boswell, a junior who edged Ferguson for the '96 title, was runner-up.

## USA Gymnastics Collegiate Championships

The USA Gymnastics Collegiate Championships originated in 1987 (as the U.S. Gymnastics Federation Collegiate Championships), essentially filling the void created when the NCAA discontinued its sponsorship of the Division II men's and women's championships. Eight teams and selected at-large individuals qualify for the women's championships. USA Gymnastics is the national governing body of the sport.

This year's USA Gymnastics Collegiate Championships will be held April 19-21 at Seattle Pacific University's Brougham Pavilion. SPU also served as host institution in both 1996 and 1997.

The national meet consists of three sessions. The first session determines the four team finalists, the individual all-around and the individual finalists for each of the four events. The second session decides the team championship and the third session, held in conjunction with the men's, determines the individual event winners. The men determine the varsity and club team champions, all-around and individual event finalists in a session conducted on the second day of the meet.

Prior to 1987, Seattle Pacific participated in two other national meets. From 1974 to 1982, the Falcons competed toward the AIAW National Championships. The NCAA sponsored a Division II meet from 1982-86, with SPU winning the final meet in 1986. The NCAA continues to sponsor a collegiate championship, comprising all divisions. Seven teams qualify for each of the five regionals.

The Falcons have qualified for national championship meets 26 times, and finished among the top four teams for 20 consecutive years between 1984-03. In addition to the 1986 NCAA crown, they also won the 1992 and '97 USAG titles. SPU qualified for the NCAA Division I West Regional in 1988 and has sent individuals on several other occasions.

## Seattle Pacific Gymnastics History

The roots of a richly successful women's intercollegiate gymnastics program at Seattle Pacific University can be traced back to 1954, when the recently-completed Brougham Pavilion was the site of the first major meet conducted west of the Mississippi River.

The inaugural women's meet, the AAU Pacific Northwest Open, featured a wide array of events which included the flying rings in addition to today's traditional disciplines. At that time, there was no balance beam on the premises, so Ken Foreman, the Seattle Pacific athletic director at the time, constructed one from a piece of lumber. The finished beam measured the required four inches in width, but was over 10 inches tall. It was Foreman, a former NCAA champion gymnast and world record-holder in the 20-foot rope climb, who organized the event. The meet, which later became known as the Washington Open in the Sixties, became an annual fixture, attracting most of the region's major clubs.

The sport began to take a more permanent foothold at SPU in 1972. George Lewis, a renowned local coach, international authority and founder of Gymnastics Incorporated, moved his club from the Seattle YMCA to Brougham Pavilion's auxiliary gym.

top-finishes from 1984-03. Individually, there have been 21 national champions—13 in the last nine years—and 134 gymnasts have been All-America.

Two years later, in 1974, the varsity program was in place, and became a national power from the outset. Two of Lewis' standouts—Laurel Anderson and Debbie Halle, both members of the U.S. National Team—formed the nucleus of the first Falcon team, along with Jenny Fooshee. A year later, Anderson, who had transferred from the University of Washington, won the national vault title, and Halle was third in the all-around. Following her graduation, Anderson succeeded Lewis as coach.

The Falcons originally competed in the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) Championships, versus teams from all competitive divisions. In 1983, the NCAA began sponsorship of regional and national championship meets, with SPU competing in Division II. The NCAA adopted an all-division championship beginning in 1987. USA Gymnastics has since conducted its own collegiate national championship for men and women, with SPU winning titles in 1992 and '97. The Falcons joined the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation for 2003. Seattle Pacific has qualified for the national meet 26 times, including 20 consecutive
