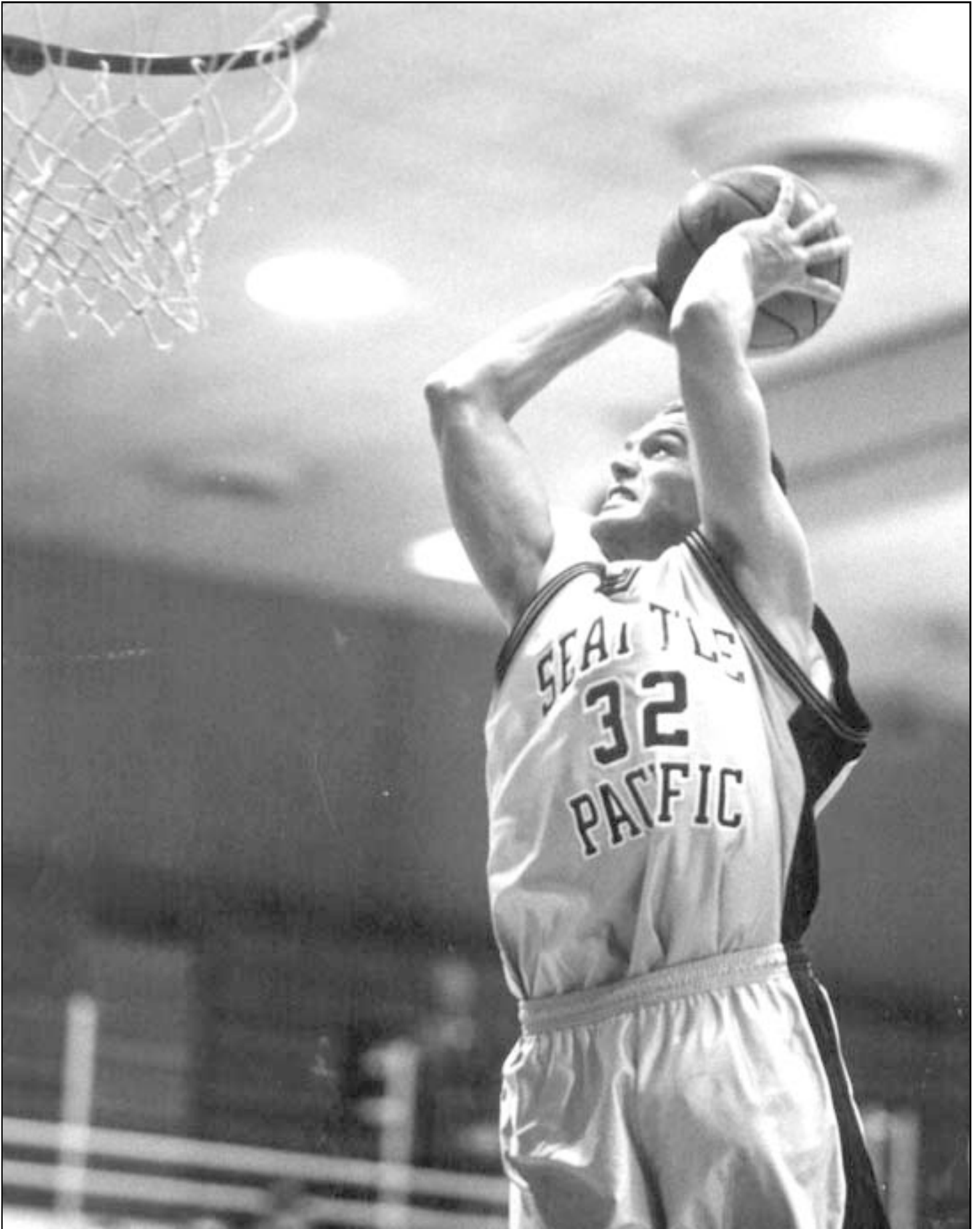

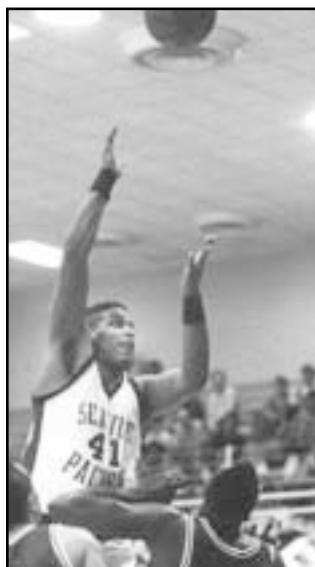

## Royal Brougham Pavilion

Royal Brougham Pavilion, now serving its fifth decade as Seattle Pacific's primary athletic facility, is not only one of the best arenas to watch a college basketball game in the Great Northwest, it's also a most formidable place to face the Falcons.

Over the past 15 seasons, the team has won 199 of 227 games played in the pavilion and all-time, dating back to 1953, the Falcons have a 533-152 record (.778 winning percentage) in Brougham. SPU won a record 27 straight home games from 1996-97, and is 125-19 over the past 10 seasons, including 69-10 in conference play.

For foes of the Falcons, Brougham has proven to be the Nightmare on Nickerson Street. For fans, it is an intimate setting; the student section bleachers roll right down to the south sideline. The north side features 700 theater-style seats with optimum sightlines and comfort. Although the pavilion is nearing its silver anniversary, a guest would never know it. In fact, Brougham was basically rebuilt during a two-phase renovation and expansion from 1988-92.

The privately-funded project added over 1,200 new seats, bringing capacity to 3,000 for concerts and 2,650 for basketball and volleyball. Beyond the main arena, new additions included six locker rooms, two classrooms, offices for athletics, intramural and physical education staff, an athletic training room, gymnastics center and crew shellhouse. More recently, the weight room was remodeled and furnished with all-new free weights and a full range of Universal equipment, and a fitness center was stocked with a wide-range of cardiovascular equipment. Other features include an auxiliary gym on the lower level, and a 70-seat lounge overlooking the main floor.

Original construction of Brougham began on May 26, 1951 and 20 months later, the project was completed for a cost of \$375,000, with most of the funds raised through private donations. In the inaugural game against Portland State on February 13, 1953, the Falcons fell to the Vikings, 66-56. A day later SPU avenged the loss, defeating Portland State 73-58.

Before Brougham was built, the basketball teams used local high school gyms as their home court, including nearby Lincoln, Queen Anne and Ballard. Several homecoming games were played off-site at the Seattle Center (now Mercer) Arena and Coliseum (now KeyArena) from 1965-87. During the renovation, games were played at Connolly Center and Edmonds Community College.

Seating capacity has fluctuated over the years. The largest single-game attendance record was established on November 9, 2000 when 2,782 attended a preseason exhibition overtime loss to the University of Washington. Prior to expansion capacity was listed at 1,800, however there were several crowds of over 2,000 before 1974.

Numerous prestigious athletic events have been held in the pavilion over the years, including three NCAA West Regionals for the men, four for the women and the USA Gymnastics Collegiate Championships in 1996 and '97.

The building's namesake, Royal Brougham, was a long-time supporter of local Christian school sports programs. He was sports editor and columnist for the *Seattle Post-Intelligencer* until his death in 1978.

## Seattle Pacific Basketball History

Basketball was first played on the Seattle Pacific University campus in 1922 in what amounted to intramural contests. Games were played in an open-air, earthen-floor gym on the site of what is now Moyer Hall.

Initially the Free Methodist Church prohibited its colleges from participating in intercollegiate athletics. Select teams, called varsity at the time, scheduled games with local churches and service clubs. In 1943-44 basketball became a full-fledged intercollegiate sport under Wesley Walls, playing eight games against four college teams.

During the 1950s, with the approval of the church and the administration, athletic director and head coach Ken Foreman built a new gymnasium—Royal Brougham Pavilion—and expanded the schedule as Seattle Pacific became affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1957, Les Habegger succeeded Foreman as coach, and proceeded to lead SPU to the NAIA playoffs three of his first four years.

The school aligned itself with the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 1962. Under Habegger, the Falcons emerged as a regional power and national contender, qualifying for the NCAA tournament five times from 1962-72, reaching the quarterfinal round in 1965.

Seattle Pacific was an NCAA independent until becoming a charter member of the original Great Northwest Conference in 1982. The GNC became the Pacific West in 1992 and the Falcons moved with nine other schools to form the Great Northwest Athletic Conference in 2001. During Ken Bone's 12-year tenure as coach, Seattle Pacific either tied for first place or won conference championships six times, and qualified for the NCAA playoffs eight of his last nine seasons, reaching the semifinals of the Elite Eight in 2000. Four years after succeeding Bone, Jeff Hironaka had SPU back in the 2006 semifinal.

Seattle Pacific owns the distinction of being affiliated with NCAA Division II longer than any other Northwest school, and the Falcons have made more NCAA tournament appearances (17) than any other Great Northwest Athletic Conference member.
