Royal Brougham Pavilion

For Royal Brougham Pavilion, now serving its fifth decade as Seattle Pacific's primary athletic facility, is not only one of the best arenas to watch a college basketball game in the Great Northwest, it's also a formidable place to face the Falcons.

Going into the 2006-07 season, Seattle Pacific has won 133 of the last 140 games played in the pavilion, including a school-record 34 consecutive victories from January of 2001 to March 2003. Over the past 19 seasons, the Falcons have prevailed in 219 of 250 games (an .876 winning percentage) and all-time, dating back to 1975, the Falcons have a 273-207 record at home.

For the foes of the Falcons, Brougham has proven to be the Nightmare on Nickerson Street. For fans, it is an intimate setting; the student section bleachers roll right down to the south sideline. The north side features 700 theater-style seats with optimum sightlines and comfort. Although the pavilion is nearing its silver anniversary, a guest would never know it. In fact, Brougham Pavilion was basically rebuilt during a two-phase renovation and expansion from 1988-92.

The privately-funded project added over 1,200 new seats, bringing capacity to 3,000 for concerts and 2,650 for basketball and volleyball. Beyond the main arena, new additions included six locker rooms, two classrooms, offices for athletics, intramural and physical education staff, an athletic training room, gymnastics center and crew shellhouse. More recently, the weight room was remodeled and furnished with all-new free weights and a full range of Universal equipment, and a fitness center was stocked with a wide-range of cardio-vascular stations. Other features include an auxiliary gym on the lower level, and a 70-seat lounge overlooking the main floor.

Original construction of Brougham began on May 26, 1951 and 20 months later, the project was completed for a cost of \$375,000, with most of the funds raised through private donations. In the inaugural event, a men's basketball game against Portland State on February 13, 1953, the Falcons fell to the Vikings, 66-56. A day later SPU avenged the loss, defeating Portland State 73-58.

Before Brougham was built, the men's basketball teams used a variety of local high school gyms as their home court, including Lincoln, Queen Anne and Ballard. Several homecoming games for both men and women were played off-site at the Seattle Center (now Mercer) Arena and Coliseum (now KeyArena) from 1965-87. During the renovation, games were played at Connolly Center and Edmonds Community College.

Seating capacity has fluctuated over the years. The largest single-game attendance record was established on November 9, 2000 when 2,782 attended a men's exhibition overtime loss to the University of Washington. Prior to expansion capacity was listed at 1,800, however there were several crowds of over 2,000 before 1974.

The building's namesake, Royal Brougham, was a long-time supporter of local Christian school sports programs. He was sports editor and columnist for the *Seattle Post-Intelligencer* until his death in 1978.

Seattle Pacific Basketball History

Women's basketball was first played on the Seattle Pacific University campus in 1928 in an intramural or club sport capacity. According to the University's official published history, the Girls Athletic Association was divided amongst college and high school-age teams. Both the men's and women's teams played in an open-air, earthen-floor gym on the site of where Moyer Hall now stands.

It was not until nearly 50 years later that women's athletics on the campus significantly changed in stature. By 1972, the Seattle Pacific club program was playing an intercollegiate schedule of sorts. Doris Heritage, a member of the physical education department faculty and an assistant track and cross country coach, directed the effort, with the aid of Steve Gough, a former national champion decathlete.

Varsity status came about in 1975, with Virginia Husted, who had succeeded Heritage and Gough, serving as the first official head coach. The Lady Falcons, as they were then known, were affiliated nationally with the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (IAIW), and locally with the Northwest Collegiate Women's Sports Association (NCWSA). For the first few years, SPU competed on a par with many of the Great Northwest's Division I schools, such as Washington, Oregon and Montana.

In 1982 Seattle Pacific affiliated with District 1 of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in several sports, including women's basketball. SPU qualified for the district playoffs on three occasions before opting to affiliate with the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II, beginning in 1991.

In 1995, the Falcons played in the NCAA tournament for the first time, falling to eventual national runnerup Portland State in the West Region semifinal game. A year after playing in their first regional title game later, the Falcons avenged that defeat on their own floor, eliminating UC Davis in overtime to advance to the 1998 NCAA Elite Eight.

A second regional championship came in 2004 as SPU won 30 consecutive games en route to the Elite Eight, and in 2005 the Falcons reached the nationally-televised NCAA Championship game. Altogether, they have played for the regional title seven of the last 10 seasons.

Under Gordy Presnell, the program achieved 18 consecutive winning seasons, and in his nine years captured six conference crowns, three regional championships and qualified for the NCAA tournament each year. Julie van Beek replaced Presnell as coach and her first team again advanced to the West title game in 2006.
