

## DOMESTIC STOCKS

CATEGORY	OBJECTIVE
Large Cap	<p><b>Large Cap Value:</b> Invests in large U.S. companies less expensive or growing more slowly than other large-cap stocks. Stocks in the top 70% of the capitalization of the U.S. equity market are defined as large-cap. Sample Companies: Boeing, Bank of America, Weyerhaeuser</p> <p><b>Large Cap Blend:</b> Invests primarily in a blend of both, Large Cap Growth stocks and Large Cap Value stocks. Returns are often similar to those of the S&amp;P 500 Index.</p> <p><b>Large Cap Growth:</b> Invests in large U.S. companies projected to grow faster than other large-cap stocks. Stocks in the top 70% of the capitalization of the U.S. equity market are defined as large-cap. Sample Companies: Microsoft, Cisco, American Express.</p>
Mid Cap	<p><b>Mid Cap Value:</b> Invests in U.S. stocks less expensive or growing more slowly than the market. Mid-cap range for market capitalization typically falls between \$1 billion - \$8 billion and represents 20% of the total capitalization of the U.S. equity market. Sample Companies: Safeco, Whirlpool, Cigna.</p> <p><b>Mid Cap Blend:</b> Invests primarily in a blend of both, Mid Cap Growth stocks and Mid Cap Value stocks.</p> <p><b>Mid Cap Growth:</b> Targets U.S. firms projected to grow faster than other mid-cap stocks. Mid-cap range for market capitalization falls between \$1 billion - \$8 billion and represents 20% of the total capitalization of the U.S. equity market. Sample Companies: Iron Mountain, Robert Half International, Paychex.</p>
Small Cap	<p><b>Small Cap Value:</b> Invests in small U.S. companies with valuations and growth rates below other smaller-cap peers. Stocks are in the bottom 10% of the capitalization of the U.S. equity market. Sample Companies: Del Monte Foods, Alaska Air, Piper Jaffray.</p> <p><b>Small Cap Blend:</b> Invests primarily in a blend of both, Small Cap Growth stocks and Small Cap Value stocks.</p> <p><b>Small Cap Growth:</b> Focuses on small, faster-growing U.S. companies. Stocks in the bottom 10% of the capitalization of the U.S. equity market are defined as small-cap. Sample Companies: Jetblue Airways, Netflix, Realnetworks.</p>

## STABLE VALUE/BONDS/FIXED INCOME

CATEGORY	OBJECTIVE
Stable Value	Invests in high-quality, short-duration bonds or debt contracts that provide a modest interest rate while maintaining maximum investment stability.
Intermediate-Term Bond	Invests in corporate and other U.S. investment-grade bonds (fixed-income issues) that have durations between three and six years.
Long-Term Bond	Invests in corporate and other U.S. investment-grade bonds (fixed-income issues) that have durations longer than six years.
High Yield Bond	Invests in U.S. high-income bonds (debt securities) that are below investment-grade. Lower quality bonds make the fund more volatile.

## ADDITIONAL INVESTMENT CATEGORIES

CATEGORY	OBJECTIVE
Balanced	Seeks to provide both growth and income by investing in stocks, bonds and cash
International	Invests primarily in foreign companies located in Europe, Latin America, and Pacific Rim countries
Specialty Sector	Focuses on achieving investment returns through specific industries within the marketplace (real estate, technology, healthcare, etc.)
