Master of Science in Nursing (MSN):

The MSN survey is administered on a regular basis, usually annually in June or July. The last survey however was sent out for a 5 year retrospective look at overall program satisfaction and employment settings. The results are from the survey administered in February 2011 and surveyed alums from the graduating classes of 2004 through 2010 (total of 224 alumni). A total of 53 alums responded to the electronic survey (response rate of 28%). Of those who responded to the survey:

- Program Satisfaction: Overall strength of the SHS graduate program -- 85% of the respondents rated the program as "excellent" to "good, above average".
 Additionally:
 - o 76% stated the SHS graduate program prepared them extremely well or very well prepared for their career.
 - o 92% reported the SHS graduate program exceeded or met own personal expectations.
- **Employment / Job search:** At least 96% are employed within the field of nursing using their graduate degree or post-masters certificate. Since graduation, 61% are employed as direct care providers and 71% had graduated within the past three years.
- **Employment / Job search:** 84% stated they were employed in the field of nursing using their graduate degree or post-masters certificate 6 months of graduation (72% were employed within 3 months of graduation).
