Country/Host	Date	Estimated Cost	Description
China English Language Institute- China www.elic.org	July 1- August 8	\$3000	Serve as an English teacher and summer camp counselor for Chinese middle and high school students. Program includes English-teaching curriculum as well as sports, field trips, skits and presentations. One and a half weeks are spent training in Hong Kong. Then students will teach in Beijing for two and a half weeks. Last, they will teach for a week in a rural community. 8 Students
Dominican Republic Foundation for Peace www.foundationforpeace.org	August 30- September 10	\$2000	Students will serve hand in hand in materially-poor communities with the local church. Program includes the building of friendships with Dominicans, community improvement activities, Vacation Bible School, medical care and experiencing the important role of the local Pentecostal churches in spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
Egypt Impact Middle-East www.impactmiddleeast.org	June 14- July 5	\$4500	Students will observe and participate in ministries to children in villages outside Cairo, orphans and residents of Cairo's garbage village. Educational opportunities include Cairo's pyramids, Egyptian museum and Coptic and Islamic sections, as well as a tour of pyramids and historic sites at Luxor. Students will engage in dialogue with Christian and Muslim individuals to learn the impact of Islam, Judaism and Christianity on Egypt and the Middle East. Requires at least two male team members.
Guatemala American Latina www.americalatinaschools.org	August 9- September 6	\$2500	Working with America Latina, an organization which focuses on education, health care, and community outreach in Guatemala. Students will experience Guatemalan culture by participating in home stays near the schools and clinics which are run by America Latina. Students will volunteer in a variety of America Latina's programs, including medical clinics and school classrooms.
India Dalit Freedom Network www.dalitnetwork.org/	June 21- July 26	\$3000	Learn about the Dalits' quest for religious freedom, social justice and human rights as one of the most oppressed people groups. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Involve in teaching at nearby Dalit schools in a variety of subjects. 2. Host fun activities for Dalit children on weekends – eg. Zoo trip, fun fair, sports, etc. 3. Educational and cultural tours. A one-credit class may be available for Education majors – September Experience. 6-10 Students
Indonesia	June 30- August 1	\$3500	Participate in ethno-tours of Indonesian islands, building relational networks for the witness of the Gospel. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Participate in work projects, sports, cultural and other community activities during island homestays. 2. Grow in awareness and understanding of Islam through conversations with Muslim individuals. 3. Engage in non-traditional missions approaches.

Russia Sunergos International www.sunergosinternational.org	August 4-31	\$4300	Serve in a HIV baby orphanage and youth runaway transit center, presenting a team-built Vacation Bible School program (with guidance from the host) in Saint Petersburg. Volunteers will provide emotional and spiritual support to children and youth through friendships and summer camp programs. 4-10 Students
Rwanda Rwanda Partners www.rwandapartners.org	June 14-July 3	\$4000	Learn about and participate in post-genocide reconciliation work through reconciliation workshops, home visits, prison ministry and economic development projects. Lead English classes, Vacation Bible School and peace-building/conflict resolution training for orphans and widows. 6 Students

Learn about Vietnamese history and culture at Duy Tan University, a SPU partner. 2. Interact with college students formally in class and informally out of class on global issues and culture 3. Support English language teaching with Fisher's Superkids Center
