Guatemala American Latina www.americalatinaschools.org	August 1-30	\$2750	Working with America Latina, an organization which focuses on education, health care, and community outreach in Guatemala, students will experience Guatemalan culture by participating in home stays near the schools and clinics which are run by America Latina. Students will serve in a variety of America Latina's programs, including medical clinics and school classrooms.
Haiti Foundation for Peace www.foundationforpeace.org	July 11-24	\$2750	Students will serve hand in hand in materially-poor communities and the local church. Program includes construction work on a vocational school, Vacation Bible School, and medical clinic assistance.
India Dalit Freedom Network www.dalitnetwork.org/	July 1-31	\$4000	Learn about the Dalits' quest for religious freedom, social justice and human rights as one of the most oppressed people groups. Help in teaching at Dalit schools in a variety of subjects. Host fun activities for Dalit children on weekends – eg. Zoo trip, fun fair, sports, etc. Participate in educational and cultural tours. 6-8 students
Indonesia	June 20 – July 21	\$3800	Engage unreached Muslim islanders in conversations about Jesus as you live with them in their fishing villages, bless them through simple development projects, and experience their unique culture.
Malawi Children of the Nations www.cotni.org	June 20 – July 18	\$4750	Participate in community health awareness, preventive care, and other projects surrounding two homes for orphans in Kasungu and Lilongwe, Malawi. 8 students
Russia Sunergos International www.sunergosinternational.org	July 3-30	\$4750	Turnout permitting, two teams. St Petersburg, Russia - Center for the Disabled Teens and Young Adults: Provide 1:1 support for a disabled or mentally-challenged young person in a day-camp setting. Velikiy Novgorod, Russia - Tuberculosis Children's Center: Lead a Vacation Bible School day camp program for non-infectious children ages 3-17 in a medical facility treating children who have been exposed to tuberculosis. Up to 16 students
Rwanda Rwanda Partners www.rwandapartners.org	Aug 12 – Sept 1	\$5000	Learn about and participate in post-genocide reconciliation work through reconciliation workshops, home visits, prison ministry and economic development projects. Lead English classes, Vacation Bible School and peace-building/conflict resolution training for orphans and widows. 6 Students, requires a 4/2 gender mix.

Thailand Displaced Orphans International www.displacedorphans.com	June 25 – July 13	\$2750	Students will engage with orphans and Burmese refugee families, helping with classroom education, Vacation Bible School, and an optometry clinic if the need exists. Up to 8 students
Vietnam Fisher’s Superkids Center www.fishersuperkids.com	June 20 – July 18	\$3000	Participate in after-school programs and summer camp activities focused on English language skills and character-building for children and youth in Danang, Vietnam.
