

Submitting an Arts Production

Do you have a recital, composition, theatrical or visual arts work, or artistic production that you would like to share with others? Faculty and students alike can now showcase work done at Seattle Pacific University through iTunes U. Make samples of your work available for community members and the public to enjoy and appreciate. To learn how to submit content to iTunes U, please follow the directions below or email iTunes@spu.edu. For information about having your content recorded, contact its@spu.edu.

To submit content, please bring it by the Instructional Technology Services office on the lower level of the SPU library. Please bring the following information with you:

- *Title of work.*
- *Name of Artist.* Can be an individual or a group.
- *Title of Artist.* Professional title for guest/faculty artists. If student, title is “Student.”
- *Composer/Author.* When performing someone else’s work.
- *Genre.* E.g., “Classical” or “One-act”
- *Date of recording*
- *Context of recording.* Was this a concert? If so, which one. Was this a class exposition? Name the class. Please briefly describe what the event was to give the work a context. When submitting multiple tracks from a single event, please also have them numbered or in the desired order.

Original content produced by SPU faculty and students will be distributed with copyright notice. Non-original content (e.g., performing someone else’s work) must fall in the public domain. Generally, the work must be 100 years or older, but some slightly newer works may still qualify. For more information, visit www.copyright.gov/circs/circ1.html#hlc.
